

As many of you know, the shakuhachi community has once again lost a very important person.

To honour Yamamoto Hozan's legacy and pay respect for the important role he has played in the shakuhachi world as a virtuoso player, flowers have been sent to the funeral service on the behalf of all ESS members.

Let's all do our best to carry on the great shakuhachi tradition. It is nice to know that Yamamoto Hozan's style of shakuhachi Tozan Ryū is well represented in the ESS (although another branch).

I have received some photos from the funeral ceremony of Yamamoto Hozan from Hōgaku Journal's Tanaka and wanted to share them with you.

Australian Shakuhachi Festival 2015

The Australian Shakuhachi Society is pleased to announce plans for the next residential Australian Shakuhachi Festival. We have booked the long weekend of 2-5 October 2015 for the Festival. ASF2015 will be the first residential shakuhachi festival or intensive camp, since 2006.

The Intensive will at the Redlands Performing Arts Centre, south of Brisbane QLD. It will follow the format of previous residential camps, and will include a student concert and a teacher's concert.

Tutors, though not confirmed, will probably include Christopher Yohmei Blasdel from Japan, Stan Kakudo Richardson from USA, Kaoru Kakizakai from Japan, Riley Kouho Lee and Bronwyn Kirkpatrick from Australia, and others.

You have over one and a half years in which to prepare for this camp, so we look forward to seeing ALL of you there!!





If you'd like to spend a relaxing afternoon talking and playing shakuhachi with other like-minded people, please consider our shakuhachi gatherings in Glebe.

The programme is very loose, but we think everyone from total beginners to the most advanced players will enjoy the experience. There are three more sessions this year, run by either Bronwyn Kirkpatrick or me.

Australia's leading taiko drumming ensemble, TaikOz, presents a concert in collaboration with one of New York City's most exciting musicians as guest artistic director and soloist.


